Lot 1 MANN BOUDOIR CAR with embossed horseshoe and monogram. 4 1/2", quarter pint. A super rare size for any seed. About Mint. Neat little piece. Grades About Mint. Est. \$100-200. MB \$70.



Lot 2 LILIENTHAL & CO. DISTILLERS. 5 3/8". Another nice seed, this is a half-pint and aside from a minute amount of interior haze, is About Mint. Very rare and not often seen. Est. \$100-200. MB \$70.



Lot 3 THE PALMS H.P. SIEMS UKIAH, CAL 5 3/8". Another rare and very hard to find half-pint seed, this is light amethyst and although cleaned, it still has some very minor scratching. A good one if you don't have it. Est. \$300-500. MB \$200.



Lot 4 CROFF & COLLINS WINES & LIQUORS DENVER & SALIDA COLO 6 1/8". Half-pint shoofly flask. Not the rarest Denver flask but always popular, this is the first we've sold. Condition is About Mint. Est. \$200-400. MB \$200.



Lot 5 D. CHESNEY 111 GRANT AVE & 133 SIXTH ST S.F. 6" Half-pint. A little rough, needs cleaning but still a good one if you don't have it. A couple minor bruises makes this an average condition bottle. Est. \$200-300. MB \$100.



Lot 6 LABEL ONLY BRASSY & CO'S SUNNY BROOK WHISKEY. Half-pint flask with "FULL 1/2 PINT" embossed on reverse. Original wooden cork. The Brassy name is not unknown to western whiskey collectors as there is an embossed amber flask they had made which is very rare. This is a nice go-with and a good one for San Jose collectors. Bottle is About Mint, label as you can see is about 85% intact. Est. \$50-100. MB \$40.



Lot 7 C.A. RICHARDS & CO. 99 WASHINGTON STREET BOSTON 7 3/8" Applied top. A crude and wonderful example of this interesting bottle. Grades About Mint. Est. \$50-100 MB \$50.



Lot 8 DOUBLE EAGLE FLASK with applied lip. GII-92. Graphite pontil. 7 1/2". Pint. Grades about Mint. Nice, deeper than usual bluish aqua. All the graphite is intact. Est. \$100-200. MB \$60.



Lot 9 RAILROAD/EAGLE FLASK 5 7/8". Sheared lip with pontil. A rich olive amber in About Mint condition. Strike's a little light. Est. \$70-120. MB \$60.



Lot 10 CORNUCOPIA/EAGLE 6 3/4" Pint. Sheared lip with pontil. A nice green example with rough pontil. Solid strike. Grades About Mint. Est. \$80-120. MB \$50.



Lot 11 SOLDIER/FANNY ESSLER PICTORIAL FLASK GXXX-11. 7 5/8" Pint. with sheared lip and pontil. Maryland Glass Works. 1860-70. Beautiful yellow green coloration on this popular flask. About Mint with a tiny in-making bit of roughness on the inside lip. Est. \$400-800. MB \$400.



Lot 12 PITKIN FLASK 5 ¼". Half-pint. 36 ribs swirled to left. New England. Nice coloration on this green example, has just a touch of gray. Sheared lip and pontil, condition couldn't get much better. Est. \$500-1000. MB \$400.



Lot 13 THE FATHER OF HIS COUNTRY 8 3/8" GI-47. Quart with applied lip and bold open pontil. A nice bluish green coloration on this popular flask. Has a 1/16" bleeding potstone on side base area. Hardly visible. A beautiful flask in About Mint condition. Est. \$400-800. Don't let the potstone detract you from bidding on this wonderful piece.



Lot 14 ZANESVILLE 24 RIBBED GLOBULAR flask. Beautiful example of this bottle, similar to Ballentine page 5. 7". Turned over collar with pontil. A truly beautiful bluish teal aqua. Has a nondescript ½" open bubble on the lower side, the bottle grades About Mint. Est. \$300-500. MB \$250.



Lot 15 DIAMOND PATTERN FLASK. 7 1/8" Sheared lip with pontil. A nice amethyst coloration on this early flask. Possibly American or Continental. Grades About Mint and has a museum type number on the base. Est. \$200-400. MB \$100.



LOT 16 PATTERN MOLDED CYNDRICAL FLASK. Sheared lip and pontiled base. A deep amethyst example with ribs swirled to left. About Mint. Est. \$200-300. MB \$100.



Lot 17 DECORATIVE EUROPEAN FLASK. Flared lip, 7 7/8". Pontil. A hefty sized molded flask. We've seen these in various sizes with various designs. A pretty bottle in About Mint condition. Est. \$10-200. MB \$70.



Lot 18 F.S. HOLLINGWORTH WHOLESALE LIQUORS WINONA, MINN. Tooled lip 6 3/8". A banded flask from Minnesota. We've not seen this example before and will leave it to you to let us know it's rarity and value. Top appears applied but on close inspection it is tooled. Has some crudity. About Mint. Est. \$50-100. MB \$50.



Lot 19 FLASK WITH BASKET WEAVE. 5 7/8" We've included this piece in our sale because of the incredible job done in the weaving of the cover. The bottle itself is clear and someone with some talent covered it. Has four areas to fasten a string or rope. This flask would hold water without the glass flask! Has a little discoloration on the weave but generally is About Mint. Est. \$50-100. MB \$30.



Lot 20 PHOENIX OLD BOURBON NABER, ALFS & BRUNE SAN FRANCISCO SOLE PROPRTS 6 1/4" Half-pint. A wonderful little example of this popular western flask. This one is a perfect example with just a hint of stain. Generally better than About Mint. Est. \$200-300. MB \$150.



Lot 21 J.F. CUTTER EXTRA OLD BOURBON TRADE MARK WITH SHIELD 7 3/8". Applied single roll lip. A very popular banded flask, these don't come up much anymore, especially in this About Mint condition. Super example with decent crudity and bubbles. Great patina and good strike! Est. \$700-1200. MB \$500.



Lot 22 LILIENTHAL & CO. S.F. 6 5/8" Double roll collar. "Cognac style". Before a half-dozen or so of these were found in Nevada last year, this was probably the best example known. It still rates as one of the best. Lots of overall whittle and appeal, this has a very minor flake off the base. A great example if you don't have one. About Mint. Est. \$1000-1500. MB \$700.
