



Lot 221 Avan HOBOKEN & COL. ROTTERDAM 11 ¾". Applied lip with shoulder seal. A nice example of the larger variant. Couldn't get much better, this is an attic bottle. Grades practically Mint. Est. \$40-80. MB \$30.



Lot 222 Avan HOBOKEN & CO. ROTTERDAM with shoulder seal and partial label. Applied lip. Another great example, this is a little smaller than the previous lot. Also Mint. Est. \$40-70. MB \$30.



Lot 223 FREEBLOWN DUTCH/BELGIAN LONG NECK UTILITY BOTTLE. Van den Bossche plate 79. 11". 1770-1840. These were mostly made for wine. This color, however, is unusual as they are typically an olive green. A super 3came in About Mint condition. This was found in the western United States believe it or not. Est. \$100-200. MB \$50.



Lot 224 CHARLES LONDON CORDIAL GIN 8 ¼". With applied square collar and smooth base. A light teal coloration, this is a fairly crude bottle in the smaller size. A brilliant color and About Mint. Very tiny amount of interior stain. Est. \$100-200. MB \$40.



Lot 225 SCHNAPP'S AROMATICO SCHIEDAM with applied top., 8 7/8". A foreign bottle possibly made in South America. These come from all over the world. Grades About Mint. Quite crude with smooth base. Est. \$50-100. MB \$30.



Lot 226 S.A. WOLF'S AROMATIC SCNAPP'S with applied top and smooth base. 9 1/2". A rare deep olive green color on this crude example. The Wolf's are pretty scarce. This is About Mint. A good one. Est. \$100-200. MB \$40.



Lot 227 DR. TOWNSEND'S SARSPARILLA ALBANY N.Y. 9 1/2". Applied top, sticky ball pontil. Here's a super crude example of this well-known bottle. An olive green with some amber, they don't get much cruder. What a piece! Grades at least Near Mint. An old and beautiful piece. Est. \$100-200. MB \$70.



Lot 228 DR. TOWNSEND'S SARSPARILLA ALBANY N.Y. 9 1/4". Applied top and smooth base. Here's one of the strangest colors we've seen yet in a Townsend's. A brilliant almost "crtoon" green, this is also an extremely whittled and crude example. You can check all the books, you won't see this one in there. We've been assured that this is an American variant. Ex .Francis Mikalonis collection. A real sparkler that grades About Mint. Est. \$500-1200. MB \$500.



Lot 229 AROMATIC SCHNAPP'S UDOLPHO WOLFES SCHIEDAM 6". ABM. A scarce little piece which also reads on one panel that it is the property of the M. Moss Co. A neat piece, it has a number of amber streaks running through the brilliant green. About Mint. Est. \$40-70. MB \$30.



Lot 230 U.S.A. HOSP DEPT. Applied top, smooth base. We've been waiting to get to this one, as we can say without reservation that it is one of the most whittled bottles we've ever seen, let alone sold. This is literally whittle on top of whittle and the color is so beautiful, it's really a delight to look at. Yellow apricot is a good way to describe it, the condition is About Mint. Lightly cleaned, here's a keeper. Est. \$400-700. MB \$350.



Lot 231 SNUFF WITH EAGLE 5". Ground lip. This is probably the best color we've seen on one of these popular snuff jars with the flat back for pushing against a wall (or each other for that matter). If you have the other colors, you gotta have this one. If you don't, you'll want it anyway. One of the brightest purples we've ever seen. This one is up to snuff. About Mint. Est. \$50-100. MB \$50.



Lot 232 ACME HAIR VIGOR label under glass. 8 1/4". Turn of the century. A beautiful red, gold and black writing. Fluted neck. Phil Eisemann had a barber shop in Lancaster, Pennsylvania. The label is about 90% intact. A neat piece in About Mint condition. Est. \$200-300. MB \$150.



Lot 233 RACE & SHELDON MAGIC WATERPROOF BOOT POLISH with applied top and open pontil. Eight sided. One of our favorite bottles in the auction, here's a bottle that has it all. These come with a couple different type tops, this one is the double rolled type. Not many bottles have the word "magic" on them and when it comes to boot polish, I'm sure at the time, it was quite magical. Just a wonderful piece, these are quite rare and are not offered at auction often. Lightly cleaned, this has loads of whittle and overall character. A nice teal coloration. Top specimen. Grades About Mint. Est. \$1000-2000. MB \$1000.



Lot 234 BLUE COLOGNE 5 1/2". Rolled lip and open pontil. 1830-60. This example has a floral design on both sides with cross hatching on one side. A highly decorative piece, similar to McKearin-Wilson plate 111#3. We've seen these in aqua but never in this gorgeous sapphire blue. What a color and what a piece. First we've sold. Bid on the very best. Practically Mint. Est. \$700-1000. MB \$400.



Lot 235 HEART-SHAPED COLOGNE. 2 1/4" with original cork. An elaborate little cologne, these are early and was probably made during the same era as the previous lot. No pontil, they were probably blown into a mold and then snapped off at the lip. A great little piece that grades About Mint. Est. \$50-100. MB \$40.



Lot 236 COLOGNE COMMEMORATING THE 1876 CENTENNIAL at the Philadelphia Centennial exposition. Is embossed "Memorial Hall 1876" with elaborate design of the hall. 6" x 2 3/4" this has a tooled lip. Not many of these historic bottles offered for sale, this one is About Mint. Est. \$200-350. MB \$200.



Lot 237 ONE PINT AMMONIA FOR WASHING 8 1/8" with applied top. A nice example of this bottle in a deeper than usual blue aqua. These are often seen without the applied top. Very drippy. Grades About Mint. Est. \$40-80. MB \$30.



Lot 238 DR. H. JAMES CANNABIS INDICA CRADDOCK & CO. PROPRIETORS NO. 225 N 2D ST. PHILA Pa. With applied top and smooth base. This is the first example we've seen of this bottle with this unusual embossing. First one we've seen with this type embossing. Very bold in a neat bluish green color. Has loads of whittle and overall crudity. Who needs to smoke cannabis when you can own a bottle like this? About Mint and was recently cleaned. Est. \$300-500. MB \$200.



Lot 239 SAND'S SARSPARILLA GENUINE NEW YORK 9 3/4". Applied top, smooth base. A nice crude example of this popular sarsaparilla. Aside from a small partially open bubble on the left shoulder, this is at least Near Mint. Has some scratches and was cleaned. Not pontiled, but this is a real crude one. Near Mint. Est. \$100-200. MB \$70.
