



Lot 284 OTTO OF ROSE COLD CREAM 3". This is also a Timothy White product from England. This has just a hint of chipping but is generally About Mint. Est. \$40-70. MB \$30.



Lot 285 ORIENTAL TOOTH PASTE. 3". An interesting lid, it seems like you either like them or you don't. These have a lot of history involved with them and it gave a great insight into what people used during the 1870's and so. This was an English lid and used to clean the teeth. A little rust but generally Near Mint. Est. \$30-60. MB \$30.



Lot 286 W & G. BUSZARD BRIDE CAKE 4". A larger sized lid, this probably held some type of candy. This has some problems with some pitting on the top and a chip off the back. Average. Est. \$20-40. MB \$20.



Lot 287 BB THAYER & CO. APOTHECARIES SAN FRANCISCO CAL. 2 3/4". Benjamin Bowditch Thayer arrived in San Francisco in 1852. He began working as a druggist at 127 Montgomery and by 1860 he sold his business to H.P. Wakelee. Until this piece was discovered, there were believed to be only two lids with his name, and three pots. This was recently discovered in San Francisco and although it is a little tough to read, it clearly shows his name. It is not unlike another lid with his name of which there are only less than 5 known. Not the greatest condition, it does have a lot of the gold paint intact and the name is clearly legible. This could be unique. A super piece and one that grades about average to better in print quality but Near Mint in pot condition. Est. \$100-200. MB \$100.



Lot 288 KEDDIE'S REAL BLOATER PASTE. 3 1/2". Another English lid, this one is in About Mint condition. It's another mystery what bloater paste was, but we're sure it's a flour and water mixture to begin making biscuits. Est. \$40-80. MB \$30.



Lot 289. L.T. FIVER VEGETABLE OR BEEF BOUILLION. 2 3/4". A colorful blue example, this has a 3/8" chip off the side of the lid. Grades Average. Est. \$20-40. MB \$20.



Lot 290 POTTED HAM & TONGUE 4 1/4". Another treat to bring along on a picnic, the English were famous for their potted tongues, meats and other delicacies. Remember pate? Here's a nice looking piece, there are a few stains and a chip to the underside of the lid but generally Near Mint. A bold lid. Est. \$40-80. MB \$30.



Lot 291 CHERRY TOOTH PASTE. 3 1/4". An elaborate lid also put out by the Timothy White company of England. This is a pretty bold impression and would grade About Mint. Est. \$30-70. MB \$30.



Lot 292. OTTO OF ROSE COLD CREAM 2 7/8". Another Otto of Rose, this is a different design. Has a little stain and generally grades Near Mint. Est. \$30-70. MB \$20.



Lot 293 FUNERAL OF THE LATE DUKE OF WELLINGTON. 5". Pot lid. On the back it is titled "Funeral of the Duke of Wellington" and then Coloured Prints From the Original Engravings by Jesse Austin 1757. There are two holes in the top for displaying it. Quite an elaborate piece, these colored lids were often made to commemorate an event. About Mint. Est. \$100-200. MB \$50.



Lot 294 THE RESIDENCE OF ANNE HATHAWAY, SHAKESPEARES WIFE pot lid. 4 1/2". "Made in England" on reverse. Another lid commemorating an event or place. A neat little piece in About Mint condition. Est. \$100-200. MB \$40.



Lot 295 UNCLE TOBY POT LID 4 1/4". A lid that shows a man stealing a kiss from a shy woman. Another English lid, no writing on the revrse. Very colorful, probably Victorian Era) as many of these were. Another one that's About Mint. Est. \$70-140. MB \$40.



Lot 296 THE VILLAGE WEDDING POT LID. 4 1/8". Here's another commemorating not an important even, per se, but rather a wedding in a small village in England. Another one that's About Mint. Est. \$80-180. MB \$40.



Lot 297 POT LID with five men in a boat rowing towards a larger ship. 4 5/16". A bright and vivid lid, this one appears later and the decoration looks like a color transfer. Very bright. About Mint \$40-120. MB \$40.



Lot 298 POT LID with comical scene of a bear school while momma bear looks on. Lid is 3 1/8" and with the frame the entire display is 5". A highly graphic and About Mint. Lid. These were made to hang on your wall and this one has the little brass ring. Est. \$100-200. MB \$50.



Lot 299 ROYAL HARBOUR RAMSGATE 6" across, potlid is 4". Another colorful scene from England, the period dress and scene depicted is quite interesting. About Mint. Est. \$100-200. MB \$50.



Lot 300 THE MASTER OF THE HOUNDS 4 1/4". A colorful lid, this one shows dogs on a foxhunt. Another fine English lid, this is About Mint. Est. \$100-200. MB \$40.



Lot 301 PEGWEIL BAY, ESTABLISHED 1760. 4". A pastoral scene depicting you kids fishing and a couple boats with a hotel name Bellevue. A nice id that grades About Mint. Est. \$90-150. MB \$40.



Lot 302 ENGLISH SCENE POT LID 7" across with 47/8" lid. There is some tape on reverse which reads "Osborne Isle". Scene shows a steamboat and a number of boats along with a large building behind it which could be a university or a government building. Has a royal emblem on the front top. A colorful piece that grades About Mint. Est. \$100-200. MB \$50.



Lot 303 POT LID WITH BUST OF NAPOLEON BONAPARTE 4". A beautiful lid with a colorful rendition of the famed emperor. Condition is About Mint. We understand this is a fairly rare piece. Est. \$100-200. MB \$50.



Lot 304 NEW YORK 1853 with a picture of the Crystal Palace. . 5". Another spectacular pot lid, this one shows the famed Crystal Palace in New York when it was first built. A number of people are outside, walking and discussing this wonder of the world. These are rare lids made in the United States. The Crystal Palace was quite a wonder of it's time, constructed after the palace in England built in 1851. The English palace was an exhibition of all that the world at the time had to offer. It was inevitable that other Nations would jump in and a carriage maker by the name of Edward Riddle organized a group of wealthy investors in New York City to create such a palace. It was built on Reservoir square near 42nd avenue and is the spot where the New York Public Library sits today. This lid is a reminder of those ambitious times. A rare and colorful piece. Grades About Mint. Est. \$500-1000. MB \$250.



Lot 305 CHERRY TOTHPASTE PATRONIZED BY THE QUEEN. 3 1/4". Another English lid, these are quite common, this is a good one in About Mint condition. Aside from a minor chip on a back edge, it is perfect. Est. \$40-80. MB \$30.
